


The Arise Amazing Race is back

THE MIRACULOUS HOST

My younger sister, Jocelyn, had undergone a total right knee replacement on 15 June 2010. Since both of us like to attend daily mass, my sister wishes to continue to receive daily holy communion even after her operation as her orthopaedic surgeon told her that she would be immobile for at least 6 weeks as it is a major operation.

With the permission of the parish priest of Sts Peter & Paul Church, after I've attended the 7.20 am Mass, I brought back holy communion for my sister who was warded at the Singapore General Hospital.

On Friday 18 June 2010, after Fr Anselm Phang handed me the pyx containing the host, I brought it straight to SGH. After my sister had said her Act of Contrition, I read to her the Gospel reading of the day. When I opened the pyx and was about to take out the host to give it to my sister, to my greatest amazement, the irregularshaped host had the imprint of the face of the crucified Jesus on it. I immediately showed it to my sister and when she saw the imprint of the crucified Jesus crowned with thorns and with sad-looking eyes, both of us cried.

When I took up the host and said "Body of Christ" and gave it to my sister, we were again moved to tears to feel so blessed that God has seen fit to offer miraculous visible proof of the Catholic teaching that the sacred words of consecration in the mass, the bread and wine upon the altar are truly changed into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

After taking that host and strengthened with the grace of God, my sister courageously with the help of the physiotherapist, came down from her bed and took her first step after her operation, using the aid of the walking frame, even though her operated leg hurts.

Before taking holy communion, my sister cried and refused to come down from the

The Holy Gospel on the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary starts with a journey, whereby Mary was all set to travel to the hill country. That reminds me of vacation! We need some kind of holiday, don't we? Sipping lemonade by a sunny beach or may be cross-country skiing at some snowy places? However, Mary didn't get to have such luxurious vacation here. She's told that she's going to be the Mother of Jesus and thus travel to visit her cousin Elizabeth - the Visitation of great significance.

The Visitation marks the beginning of a great journey in Mary's life on earth that will not end until her final journey to heaven, that's the feast we celebrate - the Assumption.

We're always so familiar with the beautiful, quiet and serene image of Mother Mary, so much so that it could be rather difficult for us to visualize her as a courageous woman who's always in action and on the move, e.g. traveling to Bethlehem while she's pregnant, escaping to Egypt with her family, traveling to Jerusalem where Jesus was lost and found and back to Nazareth, etc.

REFLECTION

Why do we honour Mary? That I guess is the most frequently asked question.

In today's gospel, Mary's song of praise, commonly known as the Magnificant has the answer to why Mary is given such great recognition in the history of the Church. It is not so much that she was chosen as the mother of God which puts her above all the other women, but simply because of her great faith in the word of God and in her total submission to God's will. 'Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made to her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'

The Magnificant focus on much more than just her blessing in bearing the Messiah. She does not focus on the child but rather on Our Father who is sending the Messiah and the purpose of his coming. That is the redemption and salvation for all generations. Mary praises God for his mercy expressed towards her. She does not regard herself as better or holier than anyone else. 'My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit exults in God my saviour; because he has looked upon his lowly handmaid.' But rather, a sinner who needs God's salvation and as the Lord's servant.

Our relationship with God is based on God Our Father who provides and listen to our needs. Have we ever allow Him to use us as His instrument to accomplish his mission? We are full of uncertainties and questions when our needs are not fulfilled. Have we ever seek God's wisdom in His word and entrust ourselves to Him with confidence just like what Mary did? If our praise and thanksgiving is based solely on our pleasant experiences and what God has done for us, let us reflect on Mary's words of praise in the Magnificant. To focus on what God has planned for us. Trusting that God in His goodness will blessed us with His covenant promises.

So why do we honour Mary? For the very fact that Mary is the model disciple in her faith in the word of God and her submission to God's will, which is more important than being humanly related with Him. Inspite of Mary's status as a virgin, she is willing to allow God to make her conceive the child Jesus, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to fulfill God's plan of salvation for all humanity.

Let us rejoice with Mary as we celebrate her glorious assumption into heaven and proclaim the goodness of the Lord. - Lectors Ministry

MESSAGE FROM THE ARCHBISHOP'S OFFICE:

PAKISTAN FLOODS

The recent floods in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province of Pakistan caused by heavy monsoon rains has resulted in more than 1,100 deaths, thousands rendered homeless and more than a million affected. Please pray for those affected by the floods.

The worldwide Church efforts are being led by Caritas Internationalis with Caritas Pakistan on the ground. In Singapore, our response is being coordinated by CHARIS or Caritas Humanitarian Aid Relief Initiatives, Singapore. CHARIS has been recently formed by expanding the role of the previous Archdiocesan Crisis Coordination Team to all overseas humanitarian work, and renaming it.

bed because bending her operated leg hurts her terribly even though the physiotherapist asked her repeatedly to learn to start to walk and not to lie on the bed.

This miraculous imprint of the face of the crucified Jesus appeared again on the irregular-shaped hosts on 21 June 2010 and also on 23 June 2010 – this time it is the imprint of Jesus in the form of the Good Shepherd, holding a staff. These two times the pyx were given to my by Fr Joseph Koh. My sister was discharged from SGH at 1.00 pm on 23 June 2010. She is now resting at home and her sutures were taken out on 29 June 2010.

She is presently undergoing physiotherapy at SGH and well on the road to recovery. She is counting the number of days and hoping that the 6 weeks would be over soon so that hopefully, she would be able to attend mass and to receive Jesus personally.

The Holy Eucharist in which Jesus Christ humbly assumes the appearance of bread and his heavenly presence that was given to us by a loving Creator and Saviour is indeed the greatest treasure in the Catholic Church.


CENTENARY OF MOTHER TERESA
